

TISS SVE special project: Skill training of Nomadic and Denotified Tribes youth in Delhi slums

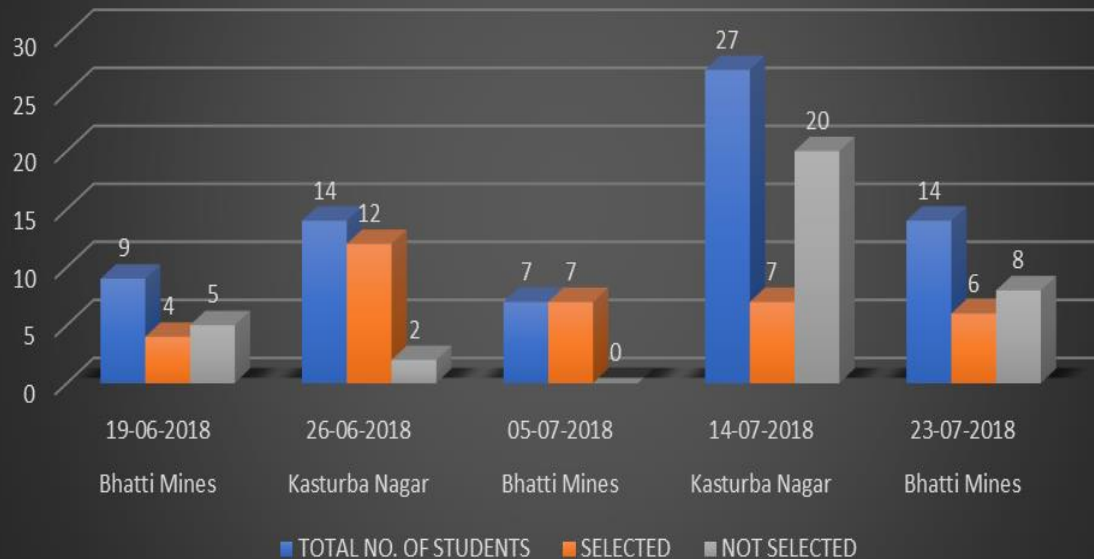
Monthly Report for the month of 15th June to 31st July 2018

Tata Institute of Social Sciences Skill Training project for Notified and Denotified Tribes is one step forward in the development of this community. The project is being implemented with the help of following partners- APAR INDIA, ACTIONAID, Common Wealth Educational Media Centre For Asia (CEMCA) and National Skill Development Cooperation

As determined the TISS NT DNT Team was successfully completed 5 batch of soft skill training at Bhatti Mines and Kasturba Nagar from 15th June 2018 to 31st July 2018. Soft skills are personal attributes that enhance an individual's interactions, job performance and career prospects. The ability to communicate through the spoken and written word is a necessity in nearly every industry and in every workplace. We were successfully able to complete the 2 batches of soft skill training in Kasturba Nagar and 3 batches in Bhatti Mines. Total 71 participants completed the soft skill training the month.

Soft Skill Training 15th June to 31st July 2018



An all community meeting was organised on 28th June, 2018 at Kastuba Nagar in presence of Prof. Dr.Medha Somaiya representing TISS, Shri R.K Jain and Shri Apar from APAR INDIA to discuss the community's aspirations and expectations with the project.

On 15th July, 2018 first domain training centre- COMPUTER HARDWARE AND NETWORKING was inaugurated at Kasturba Nagar in presence of all the community leaders, participants, Prof. Dr.Medha Somaiya, Shri R.K Jain and Shri Apar.

The counsellors had meeting with CEMCA on 24th July, 2018 regarding monthly follow up questionnaire. During a meeting with CEMCA it was decided to generate a more detailed monthly follow up format to include the basis of 1 to 5 scoring with the questions to be asked with each point so as to make it a standard questionnaire which can be used in future projects as well.

On 27th July we had meeting with one of the partners- APAR INDIA at their Rohini office. During meeting following issues were discussed- Industrial visit for the participants of Bhatti Mines, Computer soft skill course for all the

groups at Kasturba Nagar centre apart from NT-DNT training on minimum amount of

Rs 200/month, Retail Management training at the Bhatti Mines to be initiated for all the groups outside the project, to start the survey at Mongolpuri on immediate basis as part of 3rd community for the project, and discussion on upcoming soft skills training in Bhatti Mines and in Kasturba Nagar.



The mobilization team continues to work hard to get the maximum NT-DNT youth out for the soft skill training and in turn for domain specific skill development training.
