COL-CEMCA's FDP: Empowering Faculty for 21st Century Learning

The Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (COL-CEMCA) and the University of Lucknow, in collaboration with SWAYAM@Lkouniv, hosted a five-day online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "Empowering Higher Education Institutions in Technology-enabled and Blended Learning" from October 29 to November 3, 2025. Over 400 faculty members from India and abroad attended the programme, which aimed to enhance digital competencies and strengthen institutional capacities for technology-integrated teaching and learning.

The FDP featured sessions on NEP 2020, educational technology tools, AI in teaching, OERs, MOOCs, and employability skills, with hands-on activities and expert guidance. Dr. B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, emphasised the importance of collaboration, continuous upskilling, and institutional support for capacity building, encouraging participants to engage with COL-CEMCA in shaping policies on technology-enabled learning and employability.

Professor Rajesh Khambayat conducted an interactive session on educational technology tools, introducing platforms such as Edcafe,

Podcats and Blogging. Dr Sonam Bansal led an engaging session on AI in teaching and learning, with participants creating digital content, including e-books and multimedia resources using AI-powered tools. Professor Jeetendra Pande addressed OERs, MOOCs, LMS features, with hands-on activities on OER discovery, licensing and submissions. Dr Ashish Awhadiya's session covered employability skills, policy frameworks, and opportunities on SWAYAM and SWAYAM Plus for industry-relevant and credit-based learning

COL and NAAC will deliver training, conduct research, and work with 10 universities to enhance leadership, faculty skills, and policy frameworks.

He emphasised the importance of AI policy guardrails, teacher centred approaches, and micro credential frameworks for credit exchange and learner mobility, reaffirming COL's commitment to co-creation and open education.

Go Red for Dyslexia: Maldives Leads the Way in Inclusive Education

Students in the Maldives participated in the global Go Red for Dyslexia campaign, raising awareness about Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD) and promoting inclusive learning environments. This initiative follows the Maldives' participation in COL-CEMCA's workshop on inclusive education, where a regional teacher competency framework was co-developed. The campaign aims to transform the colour red into a symbol of pride and awareness, reducing stigma and building a supportive ecosystem.

Dr. B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, emphasised, "No student should be left behind." The Maldives' initiative echoes India's successful #Act4Dyslexia campaign, demonstrating the power of large scale mobilisation.

The campaign saw enthusiastic participation from students who wore red and took part in a range of activities to promote understanding of dyslexia and learning disabilities.

National Stakeholder Consultation on Vocationalisation Open Schooling in India

COL, through its Asia regional centre, CEMCA, and the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), organised a National Stakeholder Consultation on the Business Plan 2030 for Vocationalisation of Open Schooling in India on 20 November 2025. The event aimed to create a cohesive national ecosystem for vocational and skill education, leveraging technology, industry partnerships, and State Open Schools. Discussions were also held around Best Practices of Open Schooling in India and Challenges of Vocationalisation; Institutional and Industry Linkages for Open Schooling in India; and Online Technologies and Blended Learning Opportunities for Open Schooling and Vocationalisation of Open Schooling in India.

Professor Peter Scott, President and CEO, COL, emphasised the importance of collaboration to drive progress, stating, "We look forward to working with you to get that way forward delivered for all of the learners of India." Professor N S Kalsi, Former Chairperson, NCVET and Principal Consultant, COL-CEMCA, presented the proposed approach for vocationalising open schooling in India, aligning with NCF SE, NSQF, and NCrf. A six-pillar implementation framework was presented, focusing on curriculum architecture, credit pathways, vocational qualifications, blended learning, industry linkages, and quality assurance. Dr B. Three Workshops Successfully Organised on Graduate Employability

COL-CEMCA organised workshops on Graduate Employability under Results-Based Management (RBM) framework in collaboration with Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU), K K Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU), and Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU) on 12-14 November, 25-26 November, and 26-27 November 2025, respectively. The workshops, facilitated by Dr. Soni Agrawal, Consultant, CEMCA, and Dr. O.P Goel, aim to enhance learner employability by equipping faculty members with skills to develop and refine courses, ensuring quality assurance and gender rubrics, and improving institutional effectiveness in using Open and Distance Learning (ODL). Dr B Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, highlighted the importance of integrating RBM in higher education, especially in ODL institutions.

RBM Framework: Graduate Employability at BRAOU

COL-CEMCA and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Open University (BRAOU), Hyderabad, successfully organised a two day workshop on Results-Based Management (RBM) for Graduate Employability from 02-03 December 2025. The initiative focused on enhancing graduate employability through training faculty, reviewing courses for employability skills, partnering with industry for relevant courses, and promoting the initiative through webinars and information sharing.

Prof. V. Venkaiah, Consultant, COL-CEMCA, in his welcome address, emphasised that the university has developed an employability framework with COL-CEMCA's support and aimed to embed employability skills in the curriculum. He laid out the goal for the workshop, which was to understand the framework, implementation, and monitoring.

Dr B Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, expresses gratitude to BRAOU, for their leadership in graduate employability. He highlighted that the RBM framework would enhance programme effectiveness, accountability, and transparency and help the university focus on outcomes, engage stakeholders, and allocate resources efficiently.

COL and CEMCA entered a contribution agreement with Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU) on 05 December 2025, to participate in COL-CEMCA's Graduate Employability Project.

This initiative aims to enhance learners' employability skills, building on YCMOU's existing Employability Framework. The programme is part of a broader effort to improve graduate employability in India, with COL-CEMCA working with 17 open universities to develop institution-specific frameworks and skill-based courses.

Dr. B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, and Professor Sanjeev Sonawane, Vice Chancellor, YCMOU, discussed various topics, including enhancing agricultural education and empowering farmers through technology. Community Radio Awareness Workshop Concluded in Aizawl

Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (COL-CEMCA) in collaboration with the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, and the Indian Institute of Mass Communication, Aizawl, Mizoram, India, organised a "Community Radio Awareness Workshop" from 04-05 December 2025 at Aizawl, Mizoram. Over 40 participants from three Northeastern states- Assam, Mizoram and Tripura, representing various educational institutions, government departments, non-governmental organisations, and community-based organisations, attended the workshop.

Dr. B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, highlighted community radio as a powerful tool for social development, peer learning, and entertainment, emphasising that it is "operated by the people, of the people, and owned by the people themselves." He stressed its role in disseminating crucial government information and amplifying community needs, encouraging participants to leverage the training for technical and functional knowledge.

The workshop covered community radio's concept, policy, technical aspects, sustainability, and management, with expert insights from operational stations like Dibrugarh, Guwahati University, and Jadavpur University's Radio JU. A field visit to Apna Radio, IIMC Aizawl, and team building activities complemented the learning experience, aiming to equip participants with skills to establish and run successful community radio stations.

The workshop raised awareness about community radio's role in community engagement and development, and encouraged eligible organisations to apply for licenses,

setting the stage for increased collaboration and positive change in the region.

Enhancing Graduate Employability through Curriculum Redesign at TNOU

A Curriculum Redesign and Enhancement Workshop for Graduate Employability was organised from 15-17 December 2025, jointly organised by the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (COL-CEMCA) and Tamil Nadu Open University (TNOU).

Dr B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, stressed embedding skills and competencies in the Open University curriculum to enhance graduate employability and the need for “skilling, reskilling, and upskilling.” He advocated for a backward design approach, defining end competencies, crafting authentic assessments, and implementing innovative instructional strategies that incorporated active learning, experiential opportunities, and ongoing feedback to refine the curriculum.

Professor Dr. S. Arumugam, Vice Chancellor,

TNOU, emphasised aligning higher education with industry needs, highlighting the importance of graduate employability, skill development, and industry and institution linkages.

Dr. S. Suresh Babuji, Director of the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises of India (MSME), Development Institute, Government of India, the chief guest for the workshop, emphasised the importance of skill development, employability, and industry-institution linkages.

Dr. M Jayaprakashan, CEO of the Naan Mudhalvan, Skill Initiative under the Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC), underscored the importance of embedding skills into education, making it industry-relevant and accessible to all.

The expert trainer for the workshop, Dr O.P. Goel, Consultant, COL-CEMCA, set the goal for the workshop, focusing on reverse engineering industry expectations, exploring curriculum design, teaching methods, industry tie-ups, practical learning, and online support, to enhance graduate employability.

Mr T. V. Rajsekar, Executive Director of National Instructional Media Institute (NIMI), Chennai, emphasised skill development in India’s growth, assuring NIMI’s collaboration and support with TNOU on pedagogy, content development, and assessment support, stressing industry and academia collaboration and teachers’ training programmes.

The workshop outcome included a proposed employability framework to enhance the curriculum in six courses at TNOU.

Enhancing Employability through RBM at Sreenarayanaguru Open University

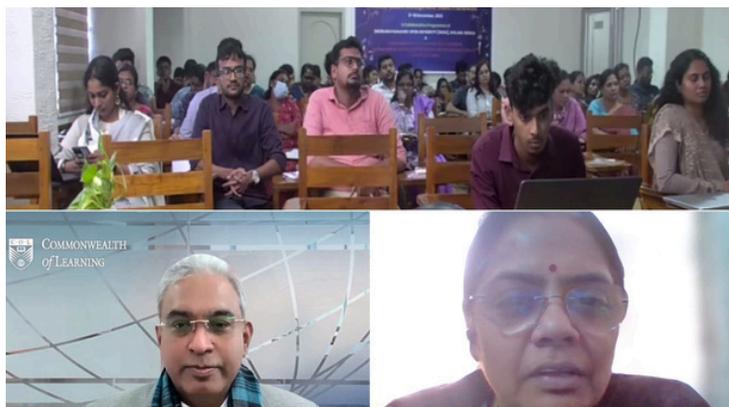

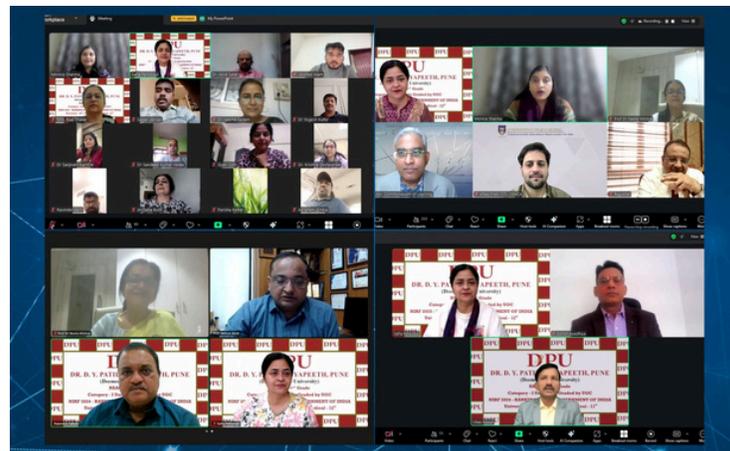
RBM framework framework benefits OUs by enhancing course relevance and effectiveness, improving student-facilitator relationships and fostering employability and entrepreneurship.

COL-CEMCA and Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth Organise FDP

COL-CEMCA in collaboration with Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune (Deemed to be University) and its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), successfully organised a five-day online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) from 16–20 December 2025 on “Empowering Higher Education Institutions in Technology-enabled and Blended Learning.” The programme witnessed the participation of over 100 faculty members from higher education institutions across India.

The FDP opened with opening remarks by Prof. Dr. Safia Farooqui, Director, Centre for Online Learning, Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune, followed by the welcome address delivered by Dr. A. N. Suryakar, Director (Administration), Dr D Y Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune. He highlighted that in the rapidly evolving educational landscape, technology is no longer a choice but a catalyst for transformation.

Dr B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA and Prof Navin Chandra Lohani, Vice Chancellor, Uttarakhand Open University (UOU), met on 19 December 2025, at the COL-CEMCA office, New Delhi to discuss collaborative initiatives, such as reducing open distance learning (ODL) dropout

rates, launching National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) recognised skill courses, and forming a Community Radio platform in Uttarakhand. The discussion encompasses three key areas of collaboration:

1. Learners' Dropout Project in the ODL System: A Pilot Project at UOU
2. Launching NCVET recognised NSQF aligned skill based courses at UOU
3. Launching a platform of Functional Community Radio Stations in Uttarakhand

The meeting paved the way for collaborative initiatives enhancing ODL in Uttarakhand. These efforts aim to promote inclusive, quality education and boost employability, strengthening UOU's impact.

COL-CEMCA and NSOU unite for an Employability-Focused Course Revamp

The Commonwealth of Learning (COL) in collaboration with Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) jointly organised a three-Day Workshop on Course Enhancement for Graduate Employability, from 22–24 December

to address the pressing concern of graduate employability in India. Nine faculty members, comprising faculty members from the five Schools of Studies at NSOU, participated in the workshop. They engaged in technical sessions on course enhancement and employability skills integration.

The workshop kicked off with an inaugural session, where Prof. Anirban Ghosh, Project Coordinator, NSOU, highlighted NSOU's commitment to embedding employability attributes.

Dr. B Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, emphasised West Bengal's MSME sector as the backbone of the state's industrial output and employment. For West Bengal HEIs, he stressed "Hyper-Local Integration" – applying global tech to local MSMEs and advocated that Vice Chancellors should foster "Transversal Skills", blending digital competency with diverse disciplines to preserve local heritage digitally

Dr. Soni Agarwal, Consultant, COL-CEMCA, highlighted India's youth power and the huge scope for impact, bridging skill gaps with an enhanced curriculum and ensuring learners get job opportunities – a win-win for MSMEs and learners.

Prof. Jane Frances Agbu, Adviser, Higher Education, COL, emphasised that employability-focused education is crucial for inclusive and sustainable development. Prof. Agbu proposed organising webinars to disseminate activities and outcomes with stakeholders, including learners, faculty, university leadership, and policymakers. She stressed the need for similar collaborations to improve learner outcomes.

The technical sessions focused on conceptual clarity and practical approaches to course enhancement for employability.

The workshop's most significant outcome was the identification and revamping of six skill-based courses from NSOU's existing Four-Year Undergraduate (FYUG) programmes. These include five Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) and one Vocational Course. All six course outlines are to be completed and submitted to COL-CEMCA by 15 January 2026.

COL-CEMCA, Reliance Foundation and Chitkara University Trained CR Managers

COL-CEMCA, in collaboration with the Reliance Foundation and Chitkara University, Chitkara Radio, Punjab, organised a Tech-based Demonstration Training for Community Radio Station (CRS) Managers on 26 December 2025, bringing together participants to explore digital tools and platforms aimed at enhancing the impact of community radio stations through technology-enabled content production and dissemination.

Prof. Dr. Ashutosh Mishra, Dean and Director, Chitkara Radio, Chitkara University, Punjab, delivered the welcome address, and Ms. Monica Sharma, COL-CEMCA, set the agenda for the sessions.

Mr. S Senthilkumaran, Program Head at Reliance Foundation, highlighted the importance of implementing technology to boost community radio effectiveness, particularly in rural transformation and addressing information asymmetry among farmers and rural communities.

Dr. B. Shadrach, Director, COL-CEMCA, delivered the special address on “Technology Enabled Futures for Community Radio” and emphasised the potential of AI and technology to enhance community radio programming, drawing parallels to the Green Revolution’s success

The Reliance Foundation Platforms & Applications Team demonstrated content access and dissemination tools, which included:

- Internet Radio Platform, covering aspects such as uploading, playlists, streaming, analytics, and file transfers.
- Orientation on WebKMS, focusing on accessing audio content related to agriculture, livestock, and marine resources in multiple Indian languages.
- IVRS dissemination, featuring a live dial-in demonstration for broadcasting and feedback collection.

Additionally, sessions were conducted on multi-location audio conferencing, featuring live recording, transcription, and broadcast capabilities. The session culminated with a presentation on text-to-audio conversion, wherein scripts are transformed into ready-to-broadcast audio content. their impact and reach.

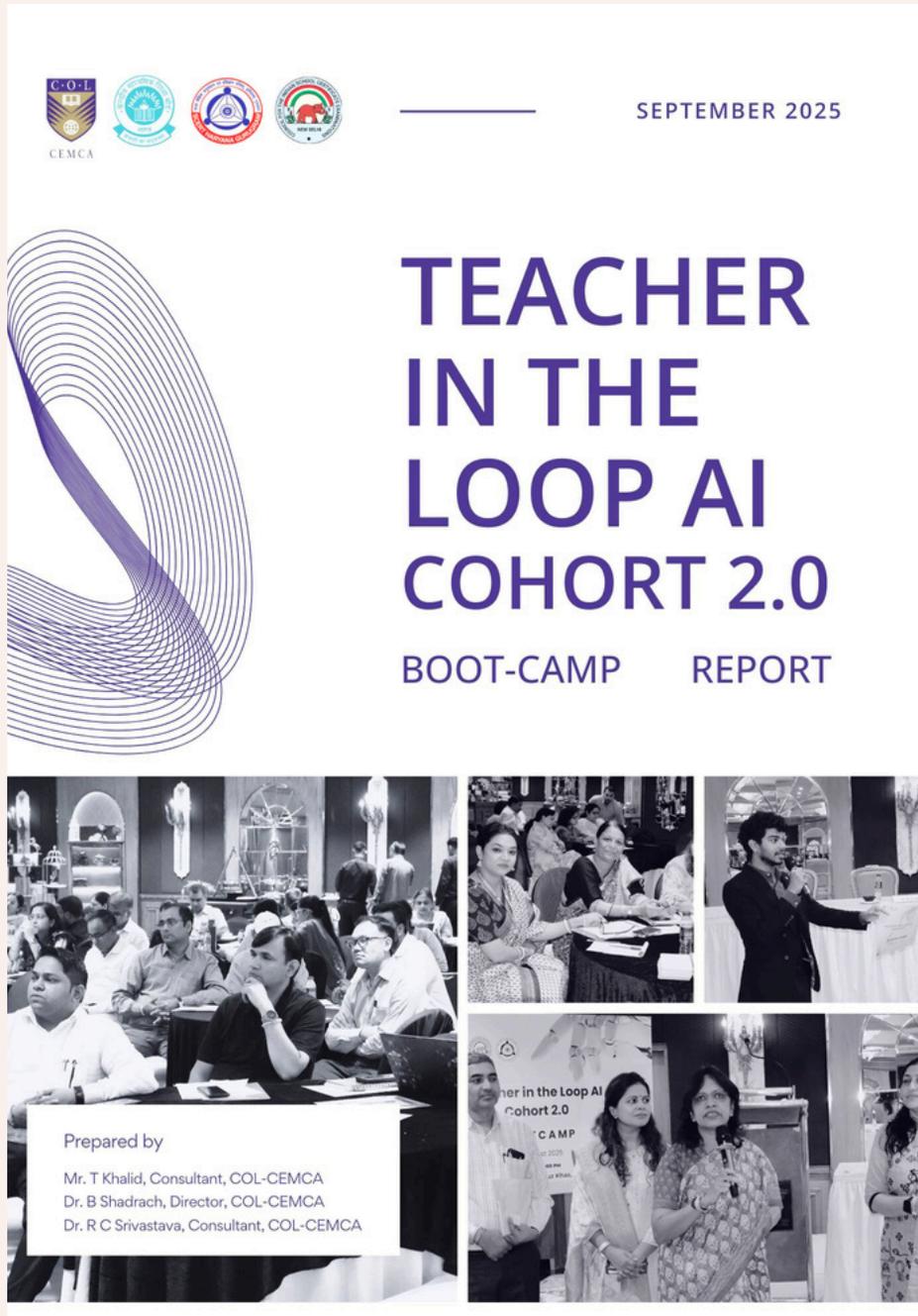
